



Statement of Requirements and Standards for Tuition Enrollment Program Administrative Guidelines

The Board of Education of East Grand Rapids Public Schools (EGRPS or the District) has determined to admit to its high school on a tuition basis a defined number of qualified nonresident students interested in pursuing a rigorous course of study prerequisite to admission to the EGRPS International Baccalaureate® (IB) Program. The District has established the following eligibility requirements or criteria in determining whether to admit a nonresident Tuition Enrollment Program (TEP) student. To be eligible to apply in a student's freshman year (or sophomore year if openings are available) for admission to the District's IB Program, the student must successfully complete the classes that any current EGRPS student (resident or nonresident) must complete. Admission to the TEP does not guarantee enrollment to the District's IB Program in a student's junior year. Enrollment in the District's IB Program will be determined spring of sophomore year.

ISD Residency Requirement

TEP students must reside within the geographic boundaries of the Kent Intermediate School District.

GPA Requirements

High School – 3.0 GPA (non-weighted) or better GPA in core subjects. Incoming 9th grade students shall be required to submit all middle school report cards.

Testing Scores

Student's M-STEP or comparable test results shall be within the proficient level of age-appropriate students in the East Grand Rapids Public Schools; all M-STEP or comparable test results must be submitted.

Grade Level

High School – Incoming students in grades higher than 9th must be on schedule to graduate in accordance with East Grand Rapids Public Schools' graduation requirements.

Student Behavior & Discipline

All Levels – Student may not have had any incidents of academic misconduct at any time prior to enrolling in the TEP.

All Levels – Student may not have had any suspension of more than 2 school days at any time prior to enrolling in the TEP.

All Levels – Student may not have been expelled from any school at any time prior to enrolling in the TEP.

All Levels – Student may not have been convicted of a misdemeanor or felony at any time prior to enrolling in the TEP which poses a likelihood of danger to the health (physical or emotional) or welfare of students or district personnel, or which makes the presence of the student in the school disruptive to the educational process.

Other Requirements

Enrollment under the TEP is limited to high school programs solely operated by the East Grand Rapids Public Schools.

Athletics

High School – Student eligibility shall be determined by MHSAA guidelines.
